Glenn Derringer is one of the few musicians who at age 30 can look back on a fantastically successful 21-year career that includes television, radio and concert appearances with such stars as Jackie Gleason, Bob Hope and Perry Como.

An accomplished pianist and organist, Glenn began his music education on the accordion at 7 and progressed to the piano and organ. Then one day there was a notice in the newspaper that auditions were being held for a series of concerts for young people by the Philadelphia Orchestra. He decided to try out, and did so on the accordion. Then Eugene Ormandy, who was conducting the auditions, noticed that he had listed organ as another instrument. "If I had an organ up here right now, would you play it for me?" Ormandy asked. Glenn said he would, and auditioned organ for him. When it came time for the announcement of the winners, he was astonished to learn that he had been chosen for both instruments.

Soon after this, when Glenn was ten, some friends of the Derringer family found out that Jackie Gleason was looking for young talent for his television show. Glenn was able to audition for Gleason, who then put Glenn on his show. After this first television appearance, Glenn received an offer from The Wurlitzer Company to tour the country for them, playing concerts. Then other things began to happen. He recorded an album titled "Young Ideas" with ABC Records, performed in concerts, and appeared on other television shows, including the Tommy and Jimmy Dorsey Show, The Ed Sullivan Show, and the Bob Hope Show.

In 1969, Glenn and his wife Marion moved to DeKalb, Illinois, where Glenn became a full-time member of the Wurlitzer staff. In addition to his duties at Wurlitzer, he enjoys a most exciting role — that of Wurlitzer's roving musical ambassador. Despite all the international travelling, Glenn is a family man who enjoys spending time at home with his wife and two young sons, Steven and Jeffrey. Glenn also participates as a director for the Amateur Organists Association International (AOAI), and is a member of the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP).
